Adkins Arboretum is operated by the nonprofit organization Adkins Arboretum, Ltd. under a 50-year lease with the Maryland Department of Natural Resources. The Arboretum is self-supporting, receiving grants from federal and state agencies and private foundations, as well as donations from members and friends, program fees, and gift shop and plant sales.

PROGRAMS AND EVENTS

PROGRAMS FOR ADULTS

The Arboretum offers programs for adults, ranging from ecology, wildlife, and gardening topics to nature photography and garden tours.

PROGRAMS FOR CHILDREN

Year-round programs for preschoolers teach lessons about nature and conservation through stories, hikes, games, puppet shows, and crafts.



The Arboretum is an outdoor classroom for school-aged children and their teachers.

GUIDED WALKS & GROUP TOURS

Arboretum docents lead themed walks on Saturday mornings from April to November, as well as group tours and outreach programs for community organizations. Guided walks are free for members!

ART EXHIBITIONS

The Arboretum hosts six art exhibitions annually by regional artists, including an annual art competition.

NATIVE PLANT SALES

Plant sales are held in May and September. More than 250 species of wildflowers, grasses, vines, shrubs, ferns, and trees, many propagated at the Arboretum's nursery from locally collected seed, are for sale.

Discover the Delmarva Peninsula's native landscape. Adkins Arboretum is a living museum,



a 400-acre native garden and preserve on Maryland's Eastern Shore dedicated to promoting the appreciation and conservation of the region's native plants. Four miles of paths traverse a diverse setting of woodlands, meadows, wetlands, streams, native gardens, and rich bottomland forests.

LEARN ECOLOGICAL LESSONS

Through its educational and science-based approach to stewardship, the Arboretum strives to inspire its community to adopt practices for a healthier and more beautiful world. Visitors learn how land stewardship affects the health of the Chesapeake Bay, and how nonnative invasive plants threaten the Delmarva Peninsula's unique and complex ecosystem. The Arboretum's interpretive program engages visitors and encourages them to apply these valuable lessons in their own backyards.

CELEBRATE OUR NATURAL HERITAGE

The Arboretum's plant communities include more than 600 species of native shrubs, trees, wildflowers, ferns, and grasses. Visitors gain an appreciation of native plant habitats that provide food and shelter for wildlife and enrich our lives by providing beauty and interest.
